Comments by President

(Kirk's comments after our 2009 Reunion)

Hello shipmates,

Well another 2 years have passed since the last reunion, not exactly the last. The last reunion was held this past April in Myrtle Beach, SC. There were 35 shipmates and their spouses at this year's gathering. Every one said they had a great time and enjoyed getting together again. We were joined by new people, new meaning they hadn't been to a reunion before. It was nice to meet them and having them attend.

The hotel most of us stayed at is located at what is called Broadway at the Beach. This is a 350 acre complex comprised of Amusement type rides for children and many, many stores for adults to browse. In the center of this complex is a man-made lake. The lake has been stocked with many fish (sterile carp) which spend most of the daylight hours with their mouths protruding from the water waiting for people to drop feed to them. The feed is available in coin operated dispensers every few feet. There were also ducks and sea gulls waiting to share the feed, I doubt they were stocked. Being a tourist area some of the prices were higher than they may have been at home but naturally browsing is always free.

Friday night nearly 30 of us went to the Carolina Opry. This was thanks to the efforts of Cathy Koppang who set it up. The show we saw was a musical tribute to the hit songs of the 60's, 70's and 80's. The Carolina Opry has a resident staff of musicians and singers who sang the songs, played the music and danced the dances. They are very talented and did an excellent job. It was hard to tell the difference between their version and the original artist's version.

Saturday night we met for dinner at a restaurant named RIOZ Brazilian Steak House. They advertise a simple price structure, the same price no matter what you eat, or how much you eat. The patron goes to a large salad bar and therefore decides what they want and the quantities of each selection. After that the main meal is a sit-down buffet, my definition anyway. There are a dozen different meats on the menu which are delivered one at a time by staff. Each server carries a skewer upon which the meat has been cooked and then dispensed from. They go from table to table and tell you what that particular meat is and ask you if you

would like some. If you want some they either cut off a piece, if the main piece is large, or they merely push a piece off the skewer using a knife, if the pieces are small. The servers rotate through the selection of meats every minute or two and don't question the quantity requested. The selection, a great one, consists of lamb, chicken, pork and beef. If you are interested you can go to their web site at www.rioz.com and get a complete description of what they have and where they are.

At our association meeting we voted on where to meet in two years and the result was Mobile Alabama. (see [2011- Sampson Reunion](#)). All the details haven't been set yet as it takes time to do all the required leg work. Bob Boney who lives in the area agreed to do that job. There was considerable discussion about going on a cruise vs. a land based location. It was decided a cruise may be created during an off year and attended by anyone wishing to go.
